I am an avid motorcyclist, and have served on several non-profit boards for ABATE (American Bikers Aimed Towards Education) a nation-wide motorcyclists' rights organization) and have held positions on county and state level, including Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Director, Political Liaison and State Safety and Education Officer (MS)
